

Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	<p>The Proclamation fixes 1 July 2024 for the commencement of the provisions of the <i>Disaster Management and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2024</i> (DMOLA Act).</p> <p>The DMOLA Act is a component of a suite of legislative reforms that will restructure Queensland's emergency services and disaster management arrangements. These reforms will amend:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> the <i>Disaster Management Act 2003</i> to enhance Queensland's disaster management arrangements; the <i>Fire and Emergency Services Act 1990</i> to establish Queensland Fire and Rescue and Rural Fire Service Queensland as dedicated fire services under the Act; and the <i>Queensland Reconstruction Authority Act 2011</i> to expand the Queensland Reconstruction Authority's functions. <p>QFES, in consultation with the Queensland Police Service and the Queensland Reconstruction Authority, has assessed the Proclamation as machinery in nature as it has the effect of commencing provisions not yet in force. QFES has identified that no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.</p>
